SANCTUARY LAMP: the lamp hanging in the sanctuary, when lit, indicates the Real Presence of Christ, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, reserved in the Tabernacle (the veil of the Tabernacle indicates the same reality). The flickering light is also a sign of the prayers of the faithful which remain after they have left the parish church. This is the whole purpose of votive lights, which we have before images of the Sacred Heart, Our Lady, St Joseph, etc. The suggested offering is \$20.00.

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Sunday readings: Today all our Scripture readings focus us on the death of Christ, He who died for our sins. Our first reading gave us a short excerpt from the lengthy ‘Suffering Servant’ prophecy of Isaiah. That prophecy refers to the “man of sorrows” (Isa 53:3) who takes our trials upon Himself, who “offers His life in atonement”(Isa 53:10), and, “By His sufferings shall my servant justify many, taking their faults on Himself”(Isa 53:11). And in the Gospel, the Lord Jesus referred to His coming death as being “a ransom for many”(Mk 10:45), or “redemption for many”. What this talk of “ransom” tells us about ourselves is: Our sins have racked up a debt. And, what this talk of “ransom” tells us about God is: He loves us so much that He has come to pay this debt Himself. Christ has come as our “supreme High Priest”(Heb 4:14) who sacrificed Himself so that we might approach “the throne of grace”(Heb 4:16) with “confidence”.

FEASTS OF THE WEEK

St John Paul II (Karol Wojtyla). Born in Poland and elected pope on 16 October 1978. He died on 2 April 2005. He was a pope with an itinerant apostolate who visited 129 nations during 104 trips abroad. He was shot during a general audience in St Peter's Square on 13 May 1981. He opened and closed the Second Holy Year of Redemption (1983/84) and the Jubilee of 2000.

St John of Capistrano (1385-1456) Educated in law at Perugia University, he was working in the Courts at Naples when the King appointed him Governor of Perugia. A war with a neighbouring town led to his imprisonment and on his release, he joined the Franciscans under the direction of St Bernadine of Siena, who inspired him to preach devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus. A gifted orator, he travelled extensively through middle and eastern Europe preaching penance and establishing several communities of Franciscan renewal. He is the patron saint of jurors.

St Anthony Mary Claret (1807-70) He was the son of a Spanish weaver. He had hoped to become a Jesuit, but poor health prevented this and he became a secular priest. In 1849, he founded the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (*Claretians*). At the request of Queen Isabella, he was appointed Archbishop of Santiago in Cuba, but opposition to his reforms within the Church led to several assassination attempts on his life and so Isabella recalled him to be her chaplain. This enabled him to continue his missionary work and he established specialist educational establishments. In 1869 he participated in the first Vatican Council. He was said to have had the gift of prophecy and to have performed miracles during his life.

Jesus’ life was the best ‘job description’: sympathy; mercy; service; compassion; and total giving. Life is rewarding when one lives for others. Do you want to serve or be served?
