SANCTUARY LAMP: the lamp hanging in the sanctuary, when lit, indicates the Real Presence of Christ, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, reserved in the Tabernacle (the veil of the Tabernacle indicates the same reality). The flickering light is also a sign of the prayers of the faithful which remain after they have left the parish church. This is the whole purpose of votive lights, which we have before images of the Sacred Heart, Our Lady, St Joseph, etc. The suggested offering is \$20.00.

FEASTS OF THE WEEK

All Saints: we celebrate the glory of all the blessed in heaven on 1st November—every person who has ever lived who is now with God in glory. But it is not only all who are *already* there that we celebrate, but we also look forward to the end of time when God will raise *all* who have ever lived, to see Him face to face and to be like Him in glory for all eternity. We pray on this feast day to the Saints who are even now in heaven, whom we call "the Church Triumphant".

All Souls': Thursday is the commemoration of All Souls in Purgatory, those whom we call the "Church suffering", and begins what is virtually a whole month of prayer for the Faithful Departed. It is worth reflecting that the month of November opens with the magnificent feast of All Saints which looks forward to the end of all things, and then we move back a stage, as it were, to consider the state of Purgatory which is the preparation many souls make before entering that final state of heaven.

St Martin de Porres (1579-1639) was the son of a Spanish nobleman and a Peruvian woman. He became a lay brother in the Dominicans at Lima, his native city. He had great aptitude for caring for the sick and the poor, and even for the welfare of animals. Moreover, he was sought after as an adviser by influential people in difficulties. By the time of his death, he was already regarded as a saint.

The blind beggar Bartimaeus would not listen to the many people scolding him to be quiet, but shouted all the louder in prayer "Son of David, have mercy on me!" Only then did Jesus call him over and answered his need. Bartimaeus becomes a powerful example of how persistent we must be in prayer when we are asking God to show us His Will for our lives.
