FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

THE KING WHO IS TO COME

Today a new year of the Church's life begins. Yet this new beginning for the Church does not look backwards to the beginning of all things, but rather forwards toward their end, which is, of course, still to come. Our Lord speaks in today's Gospel of the end times as something fearful. Yet despite the terror of the "nations in agony", the "clamour of the ocean and its waves" and the menace caused by the breaking up of the powers of the heavens, all this will only usher in a far greater event—the Return of the Son of Man, our Lord and Saviour, in all His infinite majesty and glory. Advent, as we remind ourselves each year on this its first Sunday, is a time of waiting for Christ to come again. When He came the first time to this earth, the Son of God emptied Himself of all His majesty. As St. Paul teaches us, Christ took upon Himself the condition of a slave. So He lived and even more wonderfully still, so He died in astonishing self-abasement. At the end of this Advent season we will once again commemorate that first coming over two thousand years ago in Bethlehem. Yet just as that first coming was no legend, but utterly true—so will the second be. Nevertheless, the difference will also be very great; for whereas His first coming was in the stillness of night in a very brief time of peace on earth, His second coming will take place at the end

of this period of most fearful agony in the world, and not only on this earth, but in the whole universe as well. Writers of science fiction often dwell on the vastness and emptiness of space, and upon the existence of huge forces such as black holes which are capable of annihilating our world in an instant were we to come anywhere near them. These writers portray the cosmos as terrifying not only in the contrast between its vast emptiness and its catastrophic power, but especially as utterly impersonal. The collision of galaxies, the explosions of stars of breathtaking magnitude and blinding brightness—beside which our little sun and its solar system of planets seem puny, let alone the earth which is such a small part of that system—all impress upon our imaginations the insignificance of our tiny world and our short lives. Yet the message of Advent Sunday is quite different. Behind its startling imagery of chaos and disorder. Our Lord is telling us that He will especially manifest His power and glory at the time of greatest apparent disintegration of the entire universe. It seems unimaginable to us, but the Lord who was born in Bethlehem and died on the cross both created the entire universe of which we know but a fraction, and sustains it all at every single moment by his sovereign will. And not only will He show His infinite power at that time, but He will also bring all human existence to its climactic completion. On that day, history will end-but not by dissolving into nothingness or endless chaos—not at all. On that final day the created heavens and the earth will shrivel up not by its own internal power, but by the living presence of the One who made them all. On that day, that living, personal, powerful presence will bring every human being whom He has made since our first parents to stand before Him and be judged worthy of being eternally in that presence, or not. No wonder the message He gives us today is so very urgent. He says that we must "stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to survive all that is going to happen, and to stand with confidence before the Son of Man". We cannot afford to ignore this call to wakefulness and watchfulness. But how are we to be "watchful"? By being careful for ourselves not giving ourselves over only to the cares and pleasures of this world which will only coarsen us. The Second Coming of our Saviour is a fact as real and sure as His first Coming. It is different principally in that it has not yet happened. Yet every year that goes by sees us, inevitably, one year nearer its fulfilment. How are we preparing ourselves now for that day, and for the eternity which follows it.

FEASTS OF THE WEEK

St Francis Xavier (1506-1552) He and St Ignatius Loyola, both Basques, met while they studied in Paris, and together founded the Jesuits in 1542. Francis went as a missionary to Goa and from there to Sri Lanka, Malaysia and Japan. Although he met with severe difficulties, he was in the end very successful and is regarded as perhaps the greatest individual missionary since St Paul.

St John Damascene (c. 676-749) He succeeded his father as the Christian representative at the Islamic Caliph's court in Damascus, but was not comfortable with politics and retired to a monastery in Jerusalem. He became a great theologian and as such, set his mind to the great debate at the time, which was whether it was against the First Commandment to have sacred images. He strongly defended their use as aids to prayer and worship, a teaching confirmed by the 2nd Council of Nicaea in

787. He had a deep devotion to Our Lady and wrote many hymns and sermons in her honour.

St Nicholas (d. c. 350) He was Bishop of Myra in present day Turkey, and is one of the most popular saints in Christendom. He is venerated as the patron saint of sailors, captives and, as the original *Santa Claus*, (Saint Nicklaus) of children.

St Ambrose (c. 340-397) Bishop of Milan, he was one of the greatest bishops of the early Church: an excellent administrator, a champion of the poor, fearless when dealing with tyrannical rulers and a renowned theologian. He was also the first bishop to write hymns for the use of the people to strengthen their faith and deepen their devotion. He baptised St Augustine of Hippo.
