THIS WEEK THE SANCTUARY LAMP BURNS IN MEMORY OF JOHN MACHNIK

SANCTUARY LAMP: the lamp hanging in the sanctuary, when lit, indicates the Real Presence of Christ, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, reserved in the Tabernacle (the veil of the Tabernacle indicates the same reality). The flickering light is also a sign of the prayers of the faithful which remain after they have left the parish church. This is the whole purpose of votive lights, which we have before images of the Sacred Heart, Our Lady, St Joseph, etc. The suggested offering is \$20.00.

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

OUR LORD REJECTED BY HIS OWN

In last Sunday's Gospel passage we heard how Our Lord returned to His home town of Nazareth for the first time after His Baptism and told the astonished townsfolk that Isaiah's prophecy of the Messiah was now fulfilled in their hearing by Himself. Yet because they knew Him, or thought they knew Him—"isn't this Joseph the Carpenter's son?" they would not accept that He could be anything out of the ordinary. Our Lord went on to tell them how this was like what had happened in the case of two great figures from the Old Testament, Elijah and Elisha. They had both worked miracles for foreigners in need when they had not been able to do the same thing for any of their own people in the same need. In this way He illustrated the

meaning of His words: "I tell you solemnly, no prophet is ever accepted in his own country." Yet Jesus was unruffled at the Nazarenes' fury. Although they were intent on throwing Him to His death from a very high point, He "slipped through the crowd and went away." Thus does Our Lord show Himself always in control. No one could lay hands on Him unless He willed it. It would be so once again when He allowed Himself to be arrested in Gethsemane, once again "so that the Scriptures might be fulfilled" in Him "when His Hour had come."

FEASTS OF THE WEEK

St Agatha (d. 251) A young Sicilian woman, she had dedicated her life to God, and refused to acquiesce to the demands of an influential nobleman, who knowing that she was a Christian in time of persecution, had her arrested assuming that the fear of torture and death would change her mind. It did not and she suffered horrible tortures before she was finally martyred.

Sts Paul Miki & Comps (d.1597) Son of a Japanese military leader, he was educated by the Jesuits and then joined them in 1580 and was renowned for his eloquent preaching. He and twenty-five others, including several laymen who worked for the Jesuits, were tortured and crucified at Nagasaki. They were the first martyrs of the Far East to be canonised. Nagasaki remains the most Christian city in Japan.

St Jerome Emiliana (1481-1527) A Venetian soldier, he converted whilst in prison following being captured. After his release, he became mayor of Treviso for a short time before returning to Venice where he studied for the priesthood. He dedicated the rest of his life to the care of others, particularly the sick and orphans (whose patron he is), and founded orphanages in other cities as well as a hospital and shelter for prostitutes. Others wished to join him and so he founded an order of clerks regular known as the *Somaschi*. He suffered much from poor health but always put his own sufferings aside, offering them for others.

St Josephine Bakhita (1876-1947) Although born into a wealthy Sudanese family she was kidnapped and sold into slavery. Having been bought and sold several times, suffering greatly at the hands of her 'owners' she was eventually bought by an Italian Consul who planned to free her. He took her to Italy where she was treated very well and soon converted to the Faith. She joined the Canossian Sisters in Venice where she became renowned for her compassion which was demonstrated in her care of the poor and suffering. Her biography was published in 1930 and she became a much sought-after speaker, raising funds for the missions. She was canonised in 2000 and is the first Sudanese saint.
